

NASIG Organizational Membership

Established in 1985, the North American Serials Interest Group, Inc. (NASIG) is an independent organization that promotes communication, information, and continuing education about serials and the broader issues of scholarly communication. As of 2010, NASIG welcomes memberships by organizations as well as individuals. Organizational memberships are designed to encourage investment and involvement in NASIG by the broadest possible spectrum of interested parties, while at the same time offering some unique advantages to organizations. The annual fee for an organizational membership is \$1,500 and includes:

- A table at the vendor exposition that starts off the annual conference in a no-conflict time slot (a \$1,000 value).
- Recognition of the organization's membership on the NASIG website and a link to the organization's homepage.
- The right to designate three individuals in the organization as NASIG members. These individuals can:
 - Register for the annual conference at the member rate (a savings of \$125 per registration).
 - Vote in NASIG elections.
 - Serve on committees and run for elected positions.
 - Apply for awards and service recognitions.
 - Access all NASIG Newsletters, Proceedings, and publications.
 - Access member-only sections of the NASIG website, including the membership directory and discussion forums.
 - Receive reduced registration rates for webinars, seminars, and other events offered by NASIG and partner organizations such as the National Information Standards Organization (NISO) and UKSG.

Organizational membership should be of interest to all organizations within the serials community, including universities, publishers, subscription agents, vendors, and consortia. An organizational member can assign its three individual memberships to anyone in the organization and reassign these memberships at will; an organization that wishes to send more than three people to the annual conference is encouraged to do so under whatever combination of memberships it prefers. NASIG asks that one person from the organization coordinate communications with NASIG and maintain organizational member registrations.
